Board Items:

Kyle Jacksno gave updates for the DPW: concrete pad was formed at the park building, the rest of the area will be asphalt, spring clean up was a success, hydrant flushing complete, valve checking will be complete by the end of the current week, hanging baskets will be up on Main St next week, roads and curbing will be clean before Memorial Day.

Matt Schaertl asked for the DPW to not mow the large dog park until June 10th. The small dog park remains open. Brad Hixson inquired about why hydrants used to be flushed in one day and now it takes longer. Also, Mr. Hixson inquired about what the plan for sidewalks was this year. Kyle stated that hydrants took longer as there are two DPW crew that have never flushed hydrants before so there was training taking place. Also, Kyle stated the plan for sidewalks was to start at the end of the summer.

Bob Woodhams, President of Citizen’s Hose Company, is asking the village to either cancel Tuesday night euchre at the Senior Center or use an alternative entrance. Mr. Woodhams states that CHC meetings have been held forever on the first Tuesday of every month and their meetings are being disrupted by seniors entering, exiting, and talking during their meetings. There was discussion among the board about the alternative entrance.

Ellie Shannon inquired about the water system in the village and asked Mayor Corino about the progress he has made looking into grants. Mayor Corino gave an update that the village continues to look into potions. The latest option was a 60/40 match.

Brad Hixson stated that he went to the last Town of Manchester Board Meeting where there was a lot of talk about the Village of Shortsville’s water system. Kyle gave an update explaining that Rich Vienna from the Town of Manchester is currently the Operator in Charge of the village system. Kyle explained the process and time is takes to qualify for obtaining a water license

The board and community members present had a discussion regarding the proposed Public Property Use Policy. Some questions were relating to what determines what a public versus private event are and others pertained to the liability requirements. The boards current definition of a public event is an event that is open to the public and a private event is one that is closed to the public. Trustee Langdon made a motion to approve the proposed Village of Shortsville Public Property Use Policy for Public Events and the proposed Village of Shortsville Public Use Policy for Private events, seconded by Trustee Trimm, voted and carried unanimously.

There was no further business to come before the board, so the meeting was adjourned by motion of Trustee Trimm, seconded by Trustee Langdon and carried at 6:36 P.M.
